Report Cards

Since students learn in different ways and at different rates, this will be a great time to reflect and celebrate student growth and development since the start of this school year.

Daily Health Check

As we enter Cold and Flu Season, families are encouraged to complete a daily health check (an example is located on the HPE website) with their child prior to sending them to school each day. The following guide may also be of assistance to families, as we aim to keep everyone at Highland Park as safe and as healthy as possible. Your understanding and cooperation are appreciated.

Deciding when your child is too sick for school is not always an easy decision.

Children should not come to school if they are sick and unable to participate fully in routine activities. If you have questions and concerns about your child's health, talk with a qualified healthcare professional.

Keep children at home if they have:

- a fever, and keep them home for 24 hours after the fever is gone away without the help of medication.
- · vomiting or diarrhea, and keep them home for 24 hours after the last episode.
- a severe sore throat.
- a rash with no known cause.
- a severe cough especially with other symptoms like a runny nose and headache.
- redness, swelling or discharge of the eyes, ears or skin, unless treated.
- been acting unwell and have little energy to join in school activities.

This past month, our Circle of Courage focus was in the area of *BELONGING*, with special attention to *COOPERATING*. A student from each class will be honored at our school wide assembly on Tuesday,
