### Cold Weather

It is important that students dress for the weather when coming to school. During very poor weather students will be permitted to play appropriately inside. Given our surrounding topography, when temperatures are in the range of 0 to -12 degrees at the school, students are typically expected to play outside as long as the windchill isn't too bad. When the temperature drops below -12 degrees <u>at the school</u> there is a good chance students will have an indoor recess and/or lunch. The decision to have indoor recess/lunch rests with the principal and is based on a number of factors (temperature at the school, windchill, shelters available, length of time outside, etc.). If your child arrives at

school before the bell, some teachers may choose to open their classroom doors a few minutes early on extreme cold weather days, or administration will decide to bring all students that arrive early inside to keep warm.
